## **Blanket Sunday**




On Sunday, April 21, the Lydia Circle will be asking on behalf of Church World Services for your financial support for "Blanketing the World in Love."

### From the Pastor's Desk

April was a tough month for me last year. April always contained what my family called "Birthday Week". In just 7 days each April, my grandmother, mom, dad, and me all had birthdays. You can imagine a week of birthday meals and cakes! But slowly over the last decade the number of birthdays in the week began decreasing because of deaths. Last year was the first year that all the others were gone, and it was just my lone birthday.

As it so happened last year, Easter Sunday fell during that "Birthday Week". My grandmother's and parent's birthdays fell in the days prior to Easter in Holy Week, but my birthday happened to fall on the day after Easter in the Easter Season. For someone like me and the way I think, that was strangely theological. The "Great Fifty Days" of the Easter Season is about new creation, new life, and new opportunities to experience and share faith. My first birthday without the three of them was an Easter birthday!!! This was

my chance after doing something for 58 years to now create something new and to look forward in life to new experiences.

This is true for all of us. The Easter Season (not just Easter Sunday) is the church's way of reminding all to live into the new life and new creation seen in the Risen Christ! Christ calls us all into new ways of thinking, living, and transforming society and all creation into the realm of God's justice and peace. Easter is not just to be celebrated but lived!

This three-part fusion oratorio speaks with a fresh and bold voice, incorporating a variety of musical styles seamlessly woven into a unified whole.

## **Caring for God's World**

In one of the introductory essays for The Green Bible, Dr. J. Michael Sleeth, author of the book Serve God, Save the Planet, observes that: "In the first chapters of Genesis we see a relationship that will continue throughout the pages of history: God, humans, and trees. Trees are beautiful – it is a biblical truth. Trees are also a source of oxygen. No trees means no oxygen, and no life for humans. The Tree of Life in Genesis is indeed aptly named. We show our love for the Lord by loving our neighbors. Every time our family buys anything

or takes any action, we now ask two questions: Will this help me love God? Will this help me love my neighbor? The answer always leads us to the right action. If we take shorter showers, carpool, or plant a tree, no one will necessarily notice or thank us. But if these things are done as an act to protect our neighbors, then we will have grown in Spirit."

Every year, the last Friday of April is Arbor Day. The National Arbor Day Foundation is currently making a historically ambitious effort to replant trees. Their goal is to plant 500 million new trees! Here is some information about this challenging plan:

"The world is facing mounting challenges that are threatening our very survival. The easiest and most efficient place to begin to course-correct is with trees — lots and lots of trees.

Taken at face value it seems like an overly simple notion that trees and forests can help us solve some of the biggest problems we're currently up against. What most people don't realize is that trees perform a multitude of tasks that benefit every single living thing on our planet. From standing tall on the frontlines of climate change pulling carbon from the air, to cooling our cities, to providing a home for 80 percent of all land-based animals, plants and insects, people and the planet need trees and forests now more than ever. As the world alarmingly edges its way closer to the climate ledge, trees and forests remain the most affordable, scalable, nature-based solution available today."

"We've set a goal to help us — all of us — meet the moment, by planting 500 million trees, with a focus on forests and neighborhoods of greatest need, by 2027. Our goal has always been about planting the right tree in the right place in the right soil at the right time. Never has that practice been more urgent than at this very moment. 90 percent of our reforestation work will be in forests of greatest need around the world. We will also inspire people to plant, nurture, and celebrate trees in underserved and low-canopy neighborhoods. Each dollar contributed to this effort will plant a tree. Let's plant 500 million trees together."
